"Since 2010, we have hosted the annual Southern Chefs Potluck, bringing together Georgia's best chefs and bartenders, and creating a live auction to raise money to provide families across Georgia with fresh, healthy food and to support local farmers."

In addition to the delicious food provided at the potluck, there will be several exciting new elements at the event, including a VIP pre-party hosted by Gina and Linton Hopkins. The VIP kick-off party will be held at the Inn at Serenbe with live music, cocktails created by Gina Hopkins, and small appetizers crafted by Chef Hopkins. Also, guests can look forward to the annual live auction with one-of-a-kind dinner events and exclusive experiences.
